## A clear commitment from management

1



Beyond presence and material support, **leaders must clearly express their commitments** and expectations.



When several projects are carried out in succession, it is **essential that management demonstrates its interest** through rigorous management.



It is therefore **essential that management goes to the field to see.**

## An explicit and justified objective

2



**Clarify the "why."** It must be explicit and justified.



It is up to the **sponsor to clearly answer the question "Why this project?"** This prepares the way for acceptance of the upcoming change.



We set ourselves **measurable objectives**, indicators, and a target for improvement.

## Time management

A Kaizen project, by definition, relies on **intense and concentrated mobilization.** It is necessary to plan a duration adapted to the subject.



The facilitator must be **fully dedicated during the project.** This should not be a one-off intervention or one that is diluted with other tasks.



**Communication is often neglected and considered secondary.** However, you can never communicate too much.



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
